Lieutenant Scott & Officer Frasier in attendance as well

- Focus on impacting crime: 21 murders in the district, have made significant changes over the years
- Focus on enhancing community relationships: built around various projects, clean up efforts, coffee with cops, etc.
- Focus on personal development: educational opportunities and trainings, career paths for officers, north district has the most master patrol officers city wide
- Uptick in violence since August shots fired increase, police noticed it and immediately have been deploying resources into the area
 - Started to chart shots fired going on, mostly from Capital to Park on 30th to 34th
 - Utilized over 260 hours of overtime to help with the issues
 - Used the horse team
 - Traffic stops used to be visible in the neighborhood mostly used for intel gathering
 - Arrests ranged from narcotics to warrants (wanted persons)
 - Closed down a house that was a target with a search warrant. Made 4 significant arrests
 - Many juveniles have been involved recently.

Question: Were they gang related?

Answer: Not gang, more like young kids/cliques

Question: How can we help?

Answer: Continue the flow of information, going to court does help impact sentences

- Are going to be changing the boundaries of North District
 - Trying to make communication/resources better
 - New boundaries tentatively scheduled to be released in 2020
 - Smaller geographical area for each officer to be responsible for
 - Map not ready to be released to the public yet.

Question: Will there be a manpower increase?

Answer: No increase in manpower is forecasted right now. Plan is to continue to hire as much as they can.

Question: Where is MFC in terms of crime?

Answer: District wide they are experiencing a drop in all categories, but he does not have MFC specifically

Question: Were there arrests made in the house raid today at 31st and College (642 E 31st street)?

Answer: Yes, arrests were made – plan is to get house boarded up.

- Now have an officer that is solely focused on quality of life
- Clothe the child program
 - No longer have their sponsor
 - Each district is tasked with trying to raise funds for enough money for 6 kids from North District to enjoy the holidays

 - Cost is \$500 per child
