Answer. More of just a "user house," low level felony, police have convinced property management to evict problem person, trying to put pressure on the owner to continue to make changes

 Shootings at McDonald's at 37<sup>th</sup> and Salem almost every day, cops raided the area, shootings have slowed down, able to do a search warrant

Question: 37<sup>th</sup> and Salem McDonald's a woman saw a child with a mom who was looking for narcotics, what should she do?

Answer. Advised to call DPS

Answer. About the same

## 6:49 DPW speaks

- Central Ave bridge now open!
  - Due to historical bridge documentation, had to get limestone quarry this delayed completion of bridge
- Neighborways November 2018 updated transportation integration plan
  - Comprehensive transportation plan (bike, freight, rail, vehicle), full analysis of everything, high level, long term
  - Peddle Indy plan updated bike infrastructure plan, about ½ million dollars from the scooters in the city, 4 categories: low level neighborhood residential, bike lane on a street, greenways, multimotal
  - Residential street of a bike infrastructure first drop will be 17<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> street;
    more info on indy.gov, type neighborways
  - Timeline still in planning process; waiting for mayor to sign off on funds; DPW contracted design and engineering firm; based on 20+ community engagement meetings/feedback

Question: What will the neighborways looks like?

Answer: Implementation in phases; wayfinding signs to identify route; bike has full right to the road signs; putting stop signs at more intersections

- College Ave repaving funded by community block grant
  - To be paved: College to Central & cross streets 29th-38th
  - Also updating ADA ramps & crosswalks redone

Question: Will sidewalks be redone?

Answer: Money is limited on what they can do, unfortunately do not have the funds to upgrade sidewalks, sidewalk budget gets pulled for potholes almost every year

Question: Will the north-south streets be touched (Broadway/Park/etc.)?

Answer. No just the numbered streets.

Question: Will the road lines be redone?

Answer. Crosswalks and lines will be updated, school areas will get high visibility crosswalks

 Parking will be removed temporarily during construction; no parking signs will be placed in the area where construction happening; College Ave to be completed in October sometime; rest of construction is weather dependent

- Monon trail bridge over 38<sup>th</sup> full steam ahead
  - Construction will start in March
  - Federally funded project, federal highway administration (TAP)
  - Secured grant in 2014; project has been delayed due to historical preservation concerns
  - Average of 1800 cyclists commuting through that intersection
  - Utility relocations in October; cannot be in construction during the state fair
  - Installing wide sidewalks on each side of the bridge

Question: Are you considering the changes that Friends of 38th suggested?

Answer. Major Taylor named bridge would need to be outside funded; DPW does not have the money; planning to go from 6 lane to 4 lane to put more emphasis on pedestrians and bikes (traffic study still underway)

- Will be expanding 38<sup>th</sup> and Fall Creek Parkway
  - o Construction to start in March 2020
  - Taking out curbside lane on Fall Creek and turning into multi-use trail
- Over 29 millions worth of Greenways being built in the near future
- Will have detours on trails during different constructions
